- A copy of the biographic page in your passport
- Copies of the front and back of supporting visa documentation (see Part 1)
- Current financial documentation (see Part 2)
- A \$50.00 (USD) non-refundable application fee (payable by US check or credit card through the online application)
- Students must pay a non-refundable I-20 express mailing fee upon admission and will receive further details on the mailing process, managed through UEMS/eShipGlobal.

SOURCE OF FUNDS

All documents must be written in English or accompanied by a certified translation. Original bank statements must indicate sufficient funds in cash for living expenses, tuition & fees, and related costs of study. Documents must be dated within 12 months of the program start date at the time of submission.
